May is National Bike Month. National Bike Month is a celebration of cycling held every May in the United States. It is sponsored by the League of American Bicyclists and celebrated in communities from coast-to-coast. Established in 1956, National Bike Month is a chance to showcase the many benefits of bicycling and to encourage more folks to giving bicycling a try.

Did you know we have bike trails right next to our community in Stewart State Forest?! The 6,700-acres of Stewart State Forest are a mix of wetlands, fields and forests. The site includes 18 miles of gravel roads and more than 22 miles of major trails for hiking, biking, horseback riding, hunting, dog training and trials, skiing, snowmobiling, bird watching and fishing!

SAFETY TIPS

To ride your bike safely, wear a helmet, follow traffic rules, and be visible!

<u>Traffic</u>

- Ride with the flow of traffic
- Use bike lanes or sidewalks when available
- Obey all traffic signs and signals
- Use hand signals when turning
- Listen for traffic, don't wear earbuds in both ears

Bike Maintenance

- Check your wheels, saddle, chains, pedals, handlebars, and brakes before riding
- Don't overload your bike
- Never leave your bike unattended

Protective Gear

- Wear a properly fitted
 helmet
- Wear bright clothing and reflective gear
- Use lights at night and in poor visibility

<u>Visibility</u>

- Make sure your bike has reflectors
- Use hand signals to indicate your intentions
- Ride in a straight line and don't swerve between cars

US Family Health Plan has a Health Benefits Consultant Antonia Cedeno who is serving our area, she is retired US Navy and has availability by appointment to discuss information and answer any questions you may have. The US Family Health Plan (USFHP) is available to eligible active duty family members, retired service members and their families, family members of activated National Guard and Reserve members, and survivors of deceased active duty or retired military members, all of whom must be under 65 years old and live within a USFHP service area; essentially, anyone eligible for TRICARE Prime within the designated service area can participate in USFHP. COMMUNITY REMINDERS

Spring is in the air! Now that the snow has melted away, let's take some time and tidy up the exterior! Some friendly reminders regarding the exterior condition/appearance of your home:

- Patios, balconies, and front yards must be kept neat and clean by the Tenant.
- Driveways and sidewalks will be free of oil stain marks and writing. (Sidewalk chalk is allowed on the Premises when used directly in front of or behind the Tenant's home.)
- Trash, debris, boxes and/or equipment may not be stored on patios or balconies and are not allowed to accumulate around the Premises.
- Exterior window shades are not permitted
- Towels and laundry may not be hung within patios, balconies, or from balcony railings
- Tree houses and tree swings are not permitted on the Premises, in common areas, or in any tree within Neighborhood grounds
- Bikes, toys, and lawn equipment, when not in use, should be moved to the backyard or garage. These items may not be stored in the driveway or carport or hung on any fences. Bicycles and toys shall not be left unattended in public areas or on sidewalks will be removed and disposed of by Owner.

These changes were affective in October of 2024 for new families and will apply to existing families upon signing a new lease.





COMMUNITY REMINDERS

The Team will be conducting backyard inspections beginning in May

- Mowing, raking, weeding, and trimming of shrubs and other routine maintenance in fenced backyards are the Tenant's responsibility.
- Grass shall be maintained at a height of two inches, not to exceed five inches. Raking of grass and leaves is to be done as necessary to maintain a healthy and attractive lawn.
- Shrubs are to be trimmed to maintain their shape and not block windows or doors.

Tenants who do not perform such maintenance may be given a compliance notice, and the Community Management Office may arrange needed mowing / cleanup at Tenant's expense should the Tenant not take proper care of their fenced area after receiving a compliance notice.

TRASH COLLECTION

Changes in Bulk Pick up

Due to some changes with our trash vendor, beginning **Friday, May 2nd** the vendor will no longer provide bulk trash pick up. The collection day for both trash and recycling pick up will continue weekly on Fridays.

Orange County offers 3 locations where bulk trash can be taken. A PDF with those locations and other information is attached to this correspondence or you can reach out to your community office for the information.



MAINTENANCE TIPS

PEST CONTROL

Tenant are responsible for routine control of normal household pests, along with keeping all pets free of fleas and ticks. The use of non-residual insecticides labeled for safe application by the general public, such as household spray insecticides, may be used.

Common Causes of Infestations:

- Roaches and mice thrive on leftover food placed on sinks, counters, in cupboards, on unwashed dishes, unswept floors, and on food left out for pets.
- Roaches may also feed on paper and glue products, including shelf paper.

Some things the Tenant shall do to reduce the likelihood of roaches, mice, and other household pests are:

- Maintain a sanitary living environment, depositing garbage in trash cans in plastic bags.
- Wipe up spilled food or drinks immediately and rinse any soft drink can or bottles before placing in recycling bins.
- Store any leftover food in airtight containers and be sure that all stored food is secured tightly.

Residents should contact the Maintenance Service Request Line at (845) 716-7511 for assistance for infestations of pests that are not responding to the use of non-residue insecticides.

If you have already contacted our local Management and Housing office team and are not satisfied with the outcome, or if you have words of praise to share, we encourage you to reach out to our senior management.
