GREETINGS FROM YOUR COMMUNITY DIRECTOR - KRISTEN NELSON

Summer is coming! The end of the school year and warmer weather means more kids are out and about within the neighborhood. Parents and caregivers play an essential role in keeping kids safe while enjoying summer activities. Please be sure to obey posted speed limits and stop signs when driving in the community.

POOL PASSES

Pool season is almost here! Pool passes are available for pick up at the community center Monday through Friday during normal business hours, 8AM to 5PM. Please feel free to stop by to pick up your passes. Authorized pass holders will be listed on each pass. Each pass allows 2 guests per household.

Reminder that children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult 18 or older. *No glass containers or alcohol permitted past pool gate or fence.* Inflatable rafts, water wings/floaties and toys are not permitted in the pool. Children under the age of 6 or non-swimmers (regardless of age) needing flotation devices may only wear US Coast Guard-approved life vests in the pool and must be within arm's reach of an adult guardian 18 years of age or older at all times. Failure to follow posted pool rules for lifeguards on duty could result in loss of pool privileges.

Pool hours are 11AM to 7PM, Wednesdays through Sundays, with lifeguards on duty. The pool is closed weekly on Mondays and Tuesdays for maintenance.

MAINTENANCE TIPS

Summer Energy Savings Tips:

Here are easy strategies from the Department of Energy to help save energy while you are trying to keep cool:

- Close curtains and blinds during the day to prevent heat gain through your windows.
- Vacuum air registers regularly to remove any dust build up. Ensure that furniture and other objects are not blocking airflow through your registers.
- Avoid placing lamps, scented burners, or TV's near your thermostat. The Thermostat senses heat from such items which can cause it to run longer than necessary.
- When using A/C, a ceiling fan will allow you to raise the thermostat setting about 4 degrees with no reduction in comfort. Rember that fans cool people, not rooms, by creating a wind chill effect, so please turn off the ceiling fans when you leave the room.
- Change your HVAC air filters regularly. A clogged filter reduces A/C efficiency and puts added strain on the fan motor. We provide the filters free of charge. Place a work order to schedule your filter change!

US Family Health Plan has a Health Benefits Consultant, Antonia Cedeno, who is serving our area. She is retired US Navy and has availability by appointment to discuss information and answer any questions you may have. The US Family Health Plan (USFHP) is available to eligible active duty family members, retired service members and their families, family members of activated National Guard and Reserve members, and survivors of deceased active duty or retired military members, all of whom must be under 65 years old and live within a USFHP service area; essentially, anyone eligible for TRICARE Prime within the designated service area can participate in USFHP. If anyone is interested in scheduling an appointment to meet with Antonia, please contact the leasing office directly at 845-716-7511 and they will help coordinate in scheduling an appointment.

PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET

PET SAFETY

We all love spending the long, sunny days of summer outdoors with our furry companions, but it's important to remember that like any season, summer comes with its hazards.

- · Never leave your pet tied up or unattended outdoors
- Ensure your pet has access to plenty of fresh, clean water
- Pets must be "on leash" at all times when outside the fenced area
- Pets shall not be kept in garages

BACK YARD INSPECTIONS

Reminder that back yard inspections are completed by staff periodically throughout the summer season. Grass shall be maintained at a height of two inches, not to exceed five inches. Raking grass and leaves is to be done as necessary to maintain a healthy and attractive lawn.

If you are going to be traveling or away from your home for an extended period of time, please be sure to line up lawn care services in your absence to maintain a satisfactory condition.

RVS, TRAILERS AND BOATS

HUNT MILITARY COMMUNITIES

We want to remind you that RVs, trailers and Boats are not permitted to be parked outside the premises at any time unless specifically authorized in writing by the Owner; however, such vehicles may be parked within the garage with the door closed. If you have a trailer currently parked in your driveway, we ask that they be moved no later than end of **September 1st 2025.** A list of local storage options can be requested from the leasing office at request.





COMMUNITY REMINDERS

BULK TRASH

Regular trash and recycling pick up is weekly on Fridays. Items placed for pick up must fit within the trash and recycle containers provided. Any items left outside the trash and recycling containers will not be picked up by the trash vendor.

Orange County offers 3 transfer stations where bulk items can be brought for disposal. For more information on accepted items for disposal and a list of these locations, please reach out to the leasing office.



If you have items that you are not able to transport and would be interested in scheduling an individual bulk pick up, please contact the office directly to coordinate that at 845-716-7511. Costs will be provided by the trash vendor and will be based on the size and amount of the items being disposed.

If you have items that you wish to donate and keep out of a landfill, please consider donating items to organizations like Vietnam Veterans of America. They will pick up donated items right from your driveway by scheduling an appointment. They can pick up your donation within 24 hours in most areas. 
