Attention Residents: If you currently have an **RV**, **trailer**, **or boat parked in your driveway**, please make arrangements to have it **moved no later than September 1**st. This is in accordance with updated community guidelines.

As a reminder, these vehicles are not permitted to be parked outside the premises at any time unless Stewart Terrace Family Housing has provided written authorization. However, RVs, trailers, and boats may be stored inside a garage with the door closed.

COMMUNITY POOL

Pool Passes: If you haven't picked up your passes yet, stop by the Community Center any weekday between 8:00AM and 5:00PM. Each pool pass allows up to two guests per household.

Pool Hours: The pool is open Wednesday through Sunday from 11:00AM to 7:00PM, with lifeguards on duty. The pool is closed on Mondays and Tuesdays.



SUMMER WADING POOL GUIDELINES

With the warmer weather, we'd like to remind residents about the approved use of small wading pools. To keep things safe and community-friendly, please follow these guidelines:

- Only pools under 12 inches in height are allowed.
- Water must not exceed 12 inches in depth and must be emptied daily.
- For safety purposes, adult supervision is required while in use, and when not in use, pools must be emptied, flipped over, and properly stored.
- Hot tubs, large swimming pools, spas, whirlpools, fountains, and ponds are not permitted.
- As a reminder, residents are responsible for restoring damage to the lawn caused by a pool or any other summer water toy.

MOWING REMINDERS

To help keep our community looking its best, regular lawn service is scheduled throughout the week.

Please keep these tips in mind:

- Those with a fenced backyard are responsible for maintaining their grass to an acceptable height level of no longer than two to three inches and must bag and dispose of all yard waste in their trash receptacles.
- Place any yard furniture, toys, decorations, garden hoses, and lights on concrete patios to prevent damage.
- Lawns need to be free of pet waste.
- Mowing schedules may vary due to weather—watch for updates from your community office.

MAINTENANCE TIPS

GFCI OUTLETS

You may have noticed outlets with a small reset button in your kitchen, bathroom, or garage. These are **GFCI** (**Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter**) **outlets**, and they play a key role in home safety. GFCI outlets quickly shut off power if they sense electrical hazards like moisture or ground faults, helping prevent electric shocks in high-risk areas. If power is lost to a GFCI outlet, **press the reset button to restore it**.

Sometimes, a non-GFCI outlet (like one in a living room or bedroom) may lose power because it's connected to a tripped GFCI elsewhere in the home. If that happens, check nearby GFCI outlets (or other locations in your home) for a reset button and press to restore power. If this does not restore power to your outlet, contact maintenance at (845) 716-7511.

SUMMER HEAT & YOUR AC UNIT

During high heat, AC units may struggle to keep up and can freeze or shut down. **They're designed to cool about 20°F below the outside temp**—so if it's 95°F out, your home might not hit 72°F even if the unit runs nonstop. Dirty coils, low refrigerant, or poor airflow make cooling harder. To prevent issues, change your air filter monthly. Contact your community office to pick one up. Stay cool and keep your AC running smoothly!

SAFETY TIPS

Beware of Car Temps: Studies have shown that even on mild days in the 70s, the temperature inside a parked vehicle can rapidly rise to a dangerous level for children, pets, and even adults. Leaving the windows slightly open does not significantly decrease the heating rate. HMC urges you to review the tips below from the National Weather Service to keep you and your family safe. - Touch a child's safety seat and safety belt before placing the child inside to ensure it's not too hot.
- Never leave a child unattended in a vehicle, even with the windows down.
- Always make sure children have left the car when you reach your destination. Don't leave sleeping infants in the car for any reason.

School Bus Safety Reminder – Let's Keep Our Kids Safe!

As the school year gets underway, it's a great time to review important school bus safety tips to help protect the children in our community. Whether you're a parent, student, or neighbor, a few extra moments of awareness can make all the difference.

Drivers—Please Remember:

- Stop for the bus when lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended. Never pass a bus that's loading or unloading children.
- Slow down in school zones and watch for children who may dart into the road unexpectedly.
- Stay alert near bus stops, especially during pick-up and drop-off hours.

For Families and Students:

- Arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes early.
- Stand back from the curb until the bus comes to a full stop.
- Remind kids to stay seated, keep the aisle clear, and follow the driver's instructions.
